..... Continuation of How it all works.

Being loyal to the crown does not mean we follow blindly. It is our duty to offer council to their majesties, even if they do not wish to hear it. It is also our duty to fulfill their wishes as best we can.

The Grand Master operates the Order on and off the field. He is the ultimate in decision. The Gonfanier with the help of the Turcopolier, Sergeant of the Watch, and Spear Sergeant make sure the will of the Grand Master is put into action. If there is no Grandmaster, then control of the Order falls to the Gonfanier and Chaplain under the guidance of the Council of Secular, Professed Brethren and the Knights of the First Order.

The Grand Master appoints all the positions in the Order. If the number of active Brethren should fall low, then it is his duty to appoint duties on more than one individual. The Chaplain and Gonfanier fall under this clause and can, at times, be asked to take up many duties in the Order.

The Chaplain manages the internal aspects of the Order, making sure that moral is good, that all members are working toward the goals set before them and helping keep track of the finances as well as the website. The Gonfanier manages the fighting aspects of the order, making sure practices run smoothly, that amour and weapons are well kept and that the Hospitallers are meeting all requirements placed on them by the Crown and its officers.

Doctrine

Aggression is the strongest asset the Hospitallers of St. John can apply on the field. If applied creatively both, as an offensive tool and a defensive tool, then aggression will win the day. A few warriors with the right mindset can be formidable opponents even when vastly outnumbered. Skill of arms is secondary to working together as a team, and having the heart to get the job done.


Training.

Training should be an eternal part of the Hospitallers of St. John in concerns of the war band's actions on the battlefield. This training not only includes the physical aspects of fighting, but also the training of the mind, the philosophies of the Order and the acute knowledge of the Command structure.

Physical Training

The Hospitallers of St. John should train as we expect to fight. Practices should be conducted with the War bands best interest at heart, with a set agenda and goals to accomplish for that particular practice. Individual training both in tournament fighting and in war fighting will ensure that the war band as a whole will improve on the field. It is the individual's responsibility to include themselves in the training. We are only as strong as our weakest member. Inexperience is no excuse.

Training is only effective if it produces proficient tactical warriors and leaders who form a cohesive unit capable of accomplishing their designated missions. It is not training if we just go to fighter practice and fight one another. We must set goals to battle our weakest skills. We must develop training that will help those who have trouble with charging to break past those troubles and accomplish the task.

Nine Men's Morris

Nine Men's Morris is one of the world's oldest board games:

Morris-boards in various forms have been found in ancient Egypt, Troy, in a Bronze Age Irish burial, in the Gokstad Viking ship burial, and in a variety of sources throughout Medieval and Renaissance Europe. It was widely played as a tavern and children's game.

Two players start with nine counters apiece, off the board. The game is played on the twenty-four "points" of the board: that is, the corners of each of the three squares and the intersections of squares and lines.

After choosing which of the two players will begin, the two players take turns placing their counters on the board. Counters may be placed on any empty point (i.e. intersection of lines) on the board. After all eighteen pieces are on the board, the game enters its "movement" phase: players take turns moving one piece per turn to an adjacent empty point.

In placing and moving their counters, the players try to create "mills" of three counters in a row, very much as in the simpler game known as "Tic-Tac-Toe" in modern America, and as "Naughts and Crosses" in Great Britain. Every time one player makes a "mill", he/she removes his choice of one of the other player's counters. There is one limitation to the choice, however: a player may remove a counter from a "Mill" if and only if there are no "free-standing" (not part of a mill) counters to take. A counter once removed from the board remains out of play for the remainder of the game.

A good trick: a mill may be "opened" by moving one of the three pieces off the line, then "closed on that player's next turn by returning that counter, to complete the mill again. As the return of this counter

creates a mill, one of the other player's counters is removed from the board. A still better configuration is to arrange two mills so that a single counter breaks one mill and makes another as it moves back and forth between them.

To Win:

Either player wins by reducing the other player's counters to two; or by blocking the other player from making any moves on his/her turn.

A variant: To give a nearly-beaten player a chance, some players allow the last three of a player's counters (i.e. when that player has been "pounded" down to only three pieces) to move "wild", to any empty space, whether or not it is adjacent. This prolongs the game somewhat, and can produce a surprise "upset"!

A game board may be made of wood, leather, embroidered onto a piece of cloth, or even carved/scratched into a table, chest-lid, or bench.

Counters should be differentiated by color and/or shape, and can be buttons, beads, pebbles, seashells, coins, or lumps of glass.
