
12th Night is next week and Ymir is coming up at the end of February.





#### From the Baron:




# From the Exchequer



Game Instructions: Achi

Tord Simon de Spaldying

Achi is a children's strategy game for two players, played in Ghana in West Africa. It is probably of considerable antiquity: boards for similar games have been found in Egypt dating back to 1900 BC. Research indicates that many African Americans in colonial North Carolina had Ewe, Akan, and Fante names. These three languages are spoken in the modern nation of Ghana: therefore it is possible that colonial African Americans played or at least remembered something about this game. While closely related to "Tic—Tac—Toe" (which people in the 18<sup>th</sup> Century knew by the name "Naughts and Crosses"), Achi is a more interesting game, as it has the feature of movement.

Two players start with three counters apiece, off the board. The game is played on the nine "points" of the board; that is, the corners of each of the square and the intersections of lines.

After choosing which of the two players will begin, the two players take turns placing their counters on the board. Counters may be placed on any empty point on the board. After all six pieces are on the board, the game enters its "movement" phase: players take turns moving one piece per turn to an adjacent empty point. Movement may be forward, backward, or sideways, or diagonal, but it must be along a line, and only to the next point.

In placing and moving their counters, the players try to create a "mill" of three counters in a row, along a line, as in  $Tic^Tac^Toe^*$  / "Naughts & Crosses". The first person to make a mill wins the game.


A game board can be made of wood, leather, embroidered onto a piece of cloth, or even carved/scratched into a table, chest—lid, or bench. In West Africa Achi is often played with pebbles on a board marked out on the ground. Counters should be differentiated by color and/or shape, and can be buttons, beads, buttons, pebbles, sea—shells, coins, or the lumps of glass sold in aquarium—supply shops.
