

Seneschal opened discussion on the Raven's Cove Google Group and if it was still utilized, should be utilized. It was concluded that the Google group was not necessary.




... MEETING NOTES CONTINUED

OLD LAUREL NEW ARTS

Many years ago I was honored to be raised to the wreath of the laurels for Diverse Arts.My specialty was cooking, singing, and German Landsknecht culture. But when that happened I was at a loss. Where did I go from that point forward?

I had always had a fascination with weaving. It was magic. You waved a stick over some yarn and it became something beautiful. A few months into being a young shrubbery I was gifted my first loom. I through myself into research. I had no idea there were so many forms of weaving. I finally settled on the one that spoke to me, Baltic weaving.

It is a form of weaving that uses pattern threads that you pick up individually and manipulate to create a pattern that you wish. It is different from pick-up weaving even though it uses the same concept but the colors used and the symbols woven have very specific meanings according to the area they are from.

This particular form of weaving is from the Baltic region's. Namely, Finland, Norway, Sweden, Latvia, Lithuania, Poland, and some parts of Russia. This weaving was used for everything from the cords to lower a casket to reindeer reigns and when sewn together create beautiful blankets and pillows. I was fascinated with the history and meanings of this art.

At first it was hard there were many mistakes but each mistake was just a learning experience. My skills grew. With each project I challenged myself to bigger more intricate patterns and still am. I was doing something I always wanted to do but never thought I could.

So as this new year approaches and is rendered onto us, I encourage each of you to try a new art or skill. It doesn't matter if it comes out a little wonky at first. Each mistake is just a stepping stone on the path to learning.

The bright red one was one of my first attempts. The middle one took me almost 2 years because it was double-sided, and the last was used as a hand tie in my wedding ceremony.

HISTORY OF YULE (WINTER SOLSTICE) CELEBRATIONS



""Yule" comes from Old English geol, which shares a history with the equivalent word from Old Norse, jól. Both these words referred to a midwinter festival centered around the winter solstice, which traditionally marked the halfway point of the winter season. After the solstice-the shortest day of the year-the days again begin to grow longer, so it's thought that Yule was a celebration of the re-appearance of the Sun and the fertile land's rebirth."

Yule is normally celebrated by cultures as the festival before Christmas, which includes feasts, dancing, and caroling (or wassailing). As Christianity began to spread from central Europe to the rest of the world, those cultures who celebrated Yule began to incorporate Christian traditions into old world ones. Indeed, ancient cultures such as Rome celebrated Saturnalia or the celebration of the roman god Saturn the week leading up to the winter solstice. "Saturnalia was a hedonistic time, when food and drink were plentiful and the normal Roman social order was turned upside down.

For a month, enslaved people were given temporary freedom and treated as equals. Business and schools were closed so that everyone could participate in the holiday's festivities. Also around the time of the winter solstice, Romans observed Juvenalia, a feast honoring the children of Rome."

The Norse celebrated Yule for 12 days (December 21st-January) and began the idea of burning the "Yule log" which would be burned for the entire duration of the festival. "The Norse believed that each spark from the fire represented a new piglet or calf that would be born during the coming year."

Other cultures have winter solstice celebrations as well such as the Japanese in a tradition called "Toji," in which bonfires are lit near Mount Fuji to celebrate a new year with good health.

The Iranians celebrate "Shab-e Yalda, (which translates to "Night of Birth"), Iranians all over the world celebrate the triumph of the sun god Mithra over darkness. According to tradition, people gather together to protect each other from evil, burn fires to light their way through the darkness, and perform charitable acts."

The Chinese celebrate Dong Zhi or "winter arrives" in which families celebrate the coming year with celebration. In "southern China [are] is the glutinous rice balls known as tang yuan, often brightly colored and cooked in sweet or savory broth. Northern Chinese enjoy plain or meat-stuffed dumplings, a particularly warming and nourishing food for a midwinter celebration."

However you plan to spend the holidays remember traditions are not relegated to one culture or place, everyone has their own unique way of celebrating and we encourage the education and inclusion of these cultures when re-envisioning ourselves in SCA culture.
